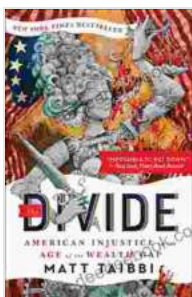


American Injustice in the Age of the Wealth Gap

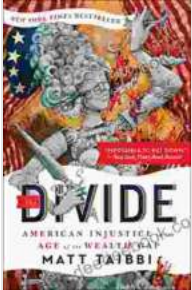

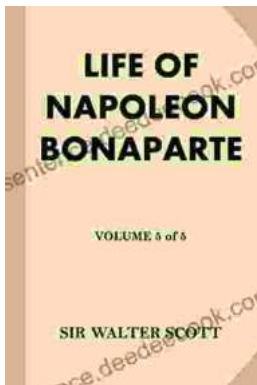

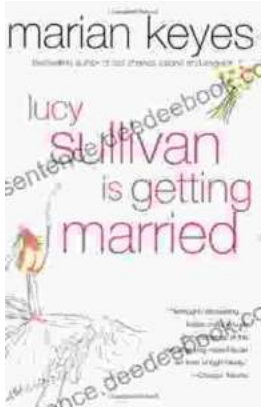
