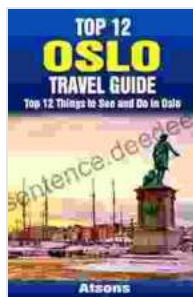


# Top 12 Things to See and Do in Oslo: Your Ultimate Travel Guide

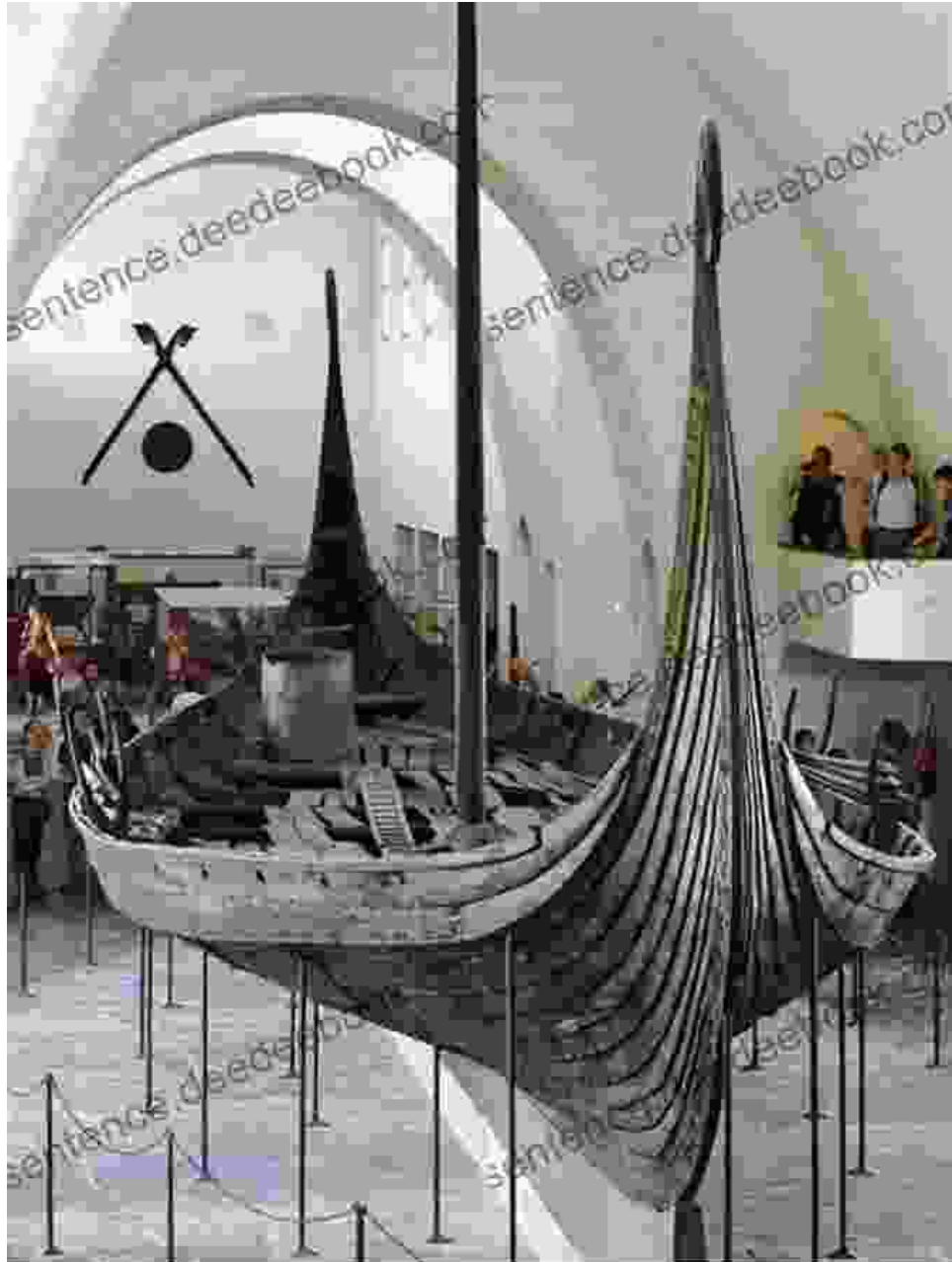

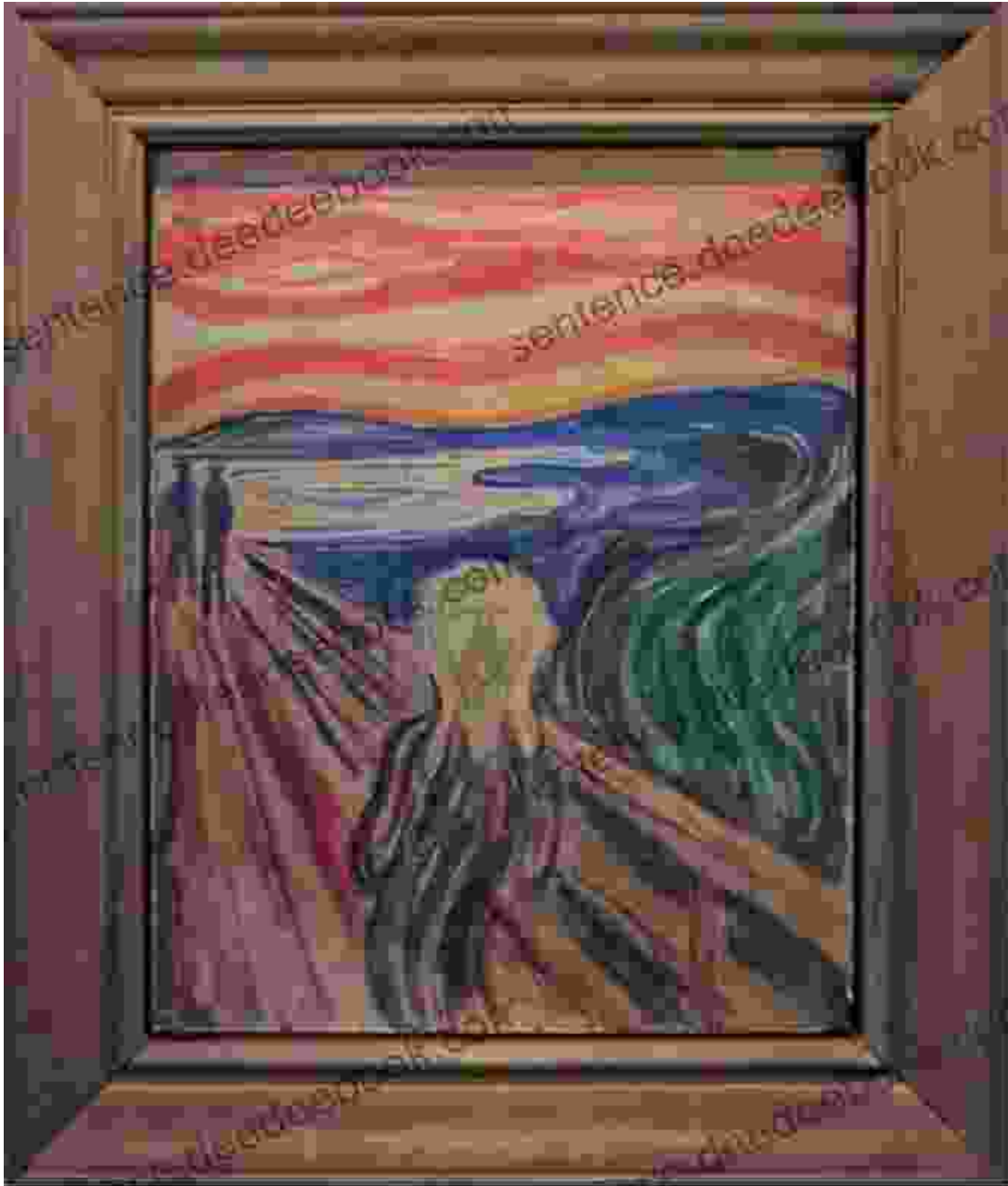
## **2. Explore the Viking Ship Museum**

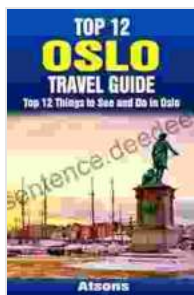

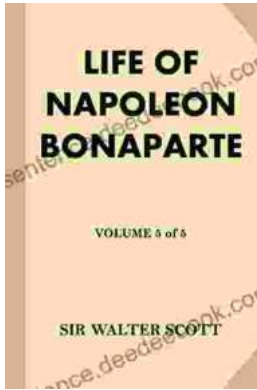
